PLEASE DO NOT PARK IN THE DESIGNATED BUS ZONE



Drop off and pick up times can be very, very busy times for schools. We remind our school community to be extra vigilant within school zones by adhering to the speed limits and zone regulations. Vehicles within the drop off area should not spend longer then the designated time identified on the signs: '2 MINS MAX'. This zone receives quite a lot of traffic and can be impacted by long term parking.



LOST PROPERTY


The Lost Property Box is overflowing!
